

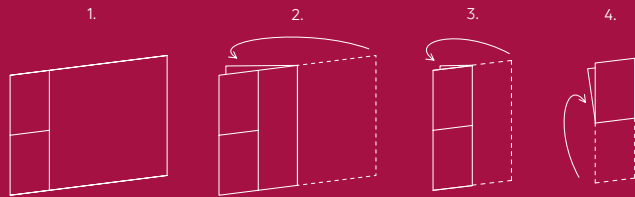

Szeged region truly has experiences for everyone, from a healing mud bath in one of the most beautiful baths of the country in Makó, adventure bathing with family in Mórahalom, an Art Nouveau walk or the open-air opera performances of Szeged, a trip back to the time of the conquering Hungarians in Ópusztaszer, or simply some idyllic moments of peace on the banks of the Holt-Maros.

4. THERMAL BATH DESIGNED BY IMRE MAKOVECZ



Makó's "Hagymatikum" Thermal Bath was designed by the world-famous architect Imre Makovecz, with the building itself inspired by Makó's most famous product, the onion. The wellness area is beautiful and wonderfully unique, and the natural thermal waters are complemented by the medicinal mud collected from the Maros River and used in the spa.

6. TREETOP EDUCATIONAL TRAIL, MAKÓ



The educational trail in Makó takes you to a very special world. Whether it's about birds or squirrels, you can explore the treetop world at a height of 10 metres, and the higher you climb, the more unique and unfamiliar these giant trees become.

7. MEZŐHEGYES STATE STUD FARM



A candidate for UNESCO World Heritage status, the estate was founded in 1784, and is home to more than three hundred horses. Three famous horse breeds have been bred here, the Nóniusz, the Gidrán, and the half-blood Mezőhegyes, and you can take a trip through Mezőhegyes history in the local memorial museum. For those interested, horse-riding and carriage rides are offered to enhance the experience.

10. ST. ELISABETH THERMAL SPA, MÓRAHALOM



Give yourself a well-deserved break at this incredible spa and try out one of its 21 pools, 17 of which are open all year round. If you're looking for undisturbed tranquility and relaxation, then the Quiet Wellness Premium Spa could be just for you. For those looking for something more exciting, the adventure pool is open year-round for families and groups of friends.

13. NATIONAL HERITAGE PARK, ÓPUSZTASZER



Visit the Ópusztaszer National Heritage Park and travel back in time over the last thousand years. This unique journey will take you back to the time of the Cumans, the conquering Hungarians, and the founding of the Principality of Hungary, travelling right up to the turn of the Millennium. Study the famous Feszty Cyclorama, explore the Nomad Park, and enjoy the Open-Air Exhibition of Ethnographic Collections presenting the history of the Southern Great Plain.

15. ANNA BATH, SZEGED



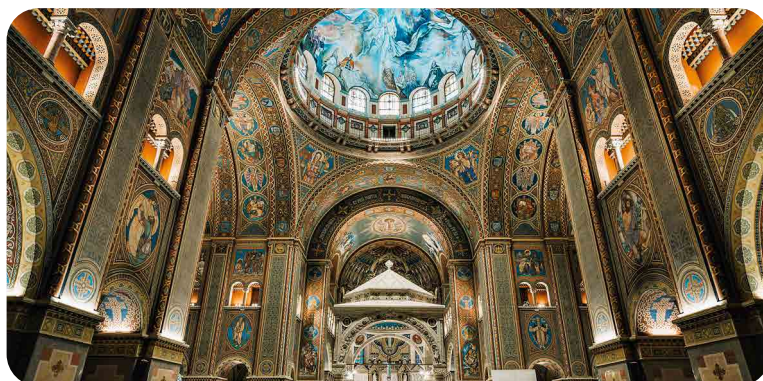
The Austrian designers of the Anna Bath modelled it on the Turkish bath style, and you can easily spend an entire morning here in this richly decorated and elegant building. It was originally completed in 1896, but when thermal water was found nearby in the early 20th century, it was turned into a health spa. Following renovations in 2004, a separate wing has been converted into dedicated thermal and wellness baths.

17. NAPPÉNYFÜRDŐ AQUAPOLIS SZEGED



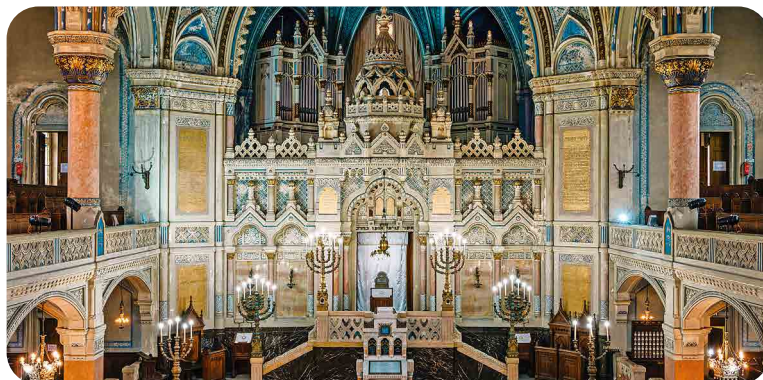
The Napfényfürdő is the most equipped fitness centre in Szeged. In addition to all the usual services, it also offers visitors its "quiet wellness" service, as well as "Aqua Night" musical night baths every two weeks hosted by the spa section.

19. VISITOR CENTRE OF THE CATHEDRAL, SZEGED



Building began on Szeged Cathedral to commemorate the escape from the great flood of 1879, although the church itself wasn't completed until 1930. Along with its stained-glass windows designed by famous artist Miksa Róth, the richly decorated interior also features an unusual mosaic depicting the Virgin Mary wearing slippers and a traditional coat from Szeged. For wonderful views of the city, the observation tower is located on the west side of the building.

23. NEW SYNAGOGUE, SZEGED



The New Synagogue of Szeged is one of the most beautiful synagogues in Europe and the second largest in Hungary. With glass windows made by Manó Róth, the synagogue was built between 1900 and 1902 according to the plans of Baumhorn Lipót, who designed the interior decoration of its huge dome to symbolise the world: the structure is supported by 24 columns, one for each hour of the day, and the motifs symbolise faith in God, the earth, and the sky.

WALKING IN DOWNTOWN SZEGED



Take a walk in the centre of Szeged, feasting your eyes on outdoor war fresco at the Heroes' Gate and enjoying the musical fountain in Dugonics Square. Pass the statues of Károlyi Street and you will shortly arrive at Széchenyi Square, home to the town hall, the Bridge of Sighs, and the Anna Fountain. From here, continue on Tisza Lajos Boulevard until you reach the wonder of Hungarian Art Nouveau, the beautiful Reök Palace.

MAKOVECZ TOUR, MAKÓ



Take a guided tour of downtown Makó and learn about the work of architect Imre Makovecz and his students. A total of 12 of the great architect's plans were implemented in the city, including the Onion Dome Music Pavilion, which hosts music concerts on summer nights, and one of his last masterpieces, the Onion House, built on the site of the former Onion Hall and today's economic and cultural centre of Makó.
