



The hiking trails crisscrossing the Mecsek Hills are a magnet for hiking enthusiasts, and one of the most exciting sights in the region is undoubtedly the Abaliget Stalactite Cave. At almost 500 metres long, legend has it that the people of Abaliget hid here, deep inside the healing cave, to escape the invading Turks.

18. CELLA SEPTICHORA VISITOR CENTER



Learn about early Christian burial traditions in the northern and western provinces of the Roman Empire. The ancient Christian cemetery of Sopianae (the Roman name for Pécs) is both a Hungarikum and a UNESCO World Heritage Site, and there is also the option to take part in an exciting nighttime guided tour at the Cella Septichora Visitor Center.

34. ZSOLNAY CULTURAL QUARTER



Declared a Hungarikum in 2014, the Cultural Quarter is located just a few minutes' walk from the city centre, but even were it not so close, with its eye-catching, ornate tiled roofs it would be near impossible to miss. The park here is open to everyone and has plenty to see, including 88 public Zsolnay statues, 15 listed buildings, and an exhibition that displays the history of the famous Zsolnay porcelain maker family and their factory.

42. CELLAR-ROW OF VILLÁNYKÖVESD



Located in Villánykövesd, these are probably the most romantic wine cellars in the Villány wine region. Protected as listed buildings, this triple-level cellar village attracts scores of visitors each year, and their distinctive coloured gates are open to visitors all year round, offering a glimpse of the wine processing stages and a chance to taste the world-famous, quality wines.

4. HARKÁNY THERMAL BATH



Discover the unique, healing thermal waters of the famous Harkány Thermal Bath. Those looking to recover can take a bath in the healing waters of the spa, while the new Water World Park offers fun and recreation to more adventurous types all year round. But there's so much to try here beyond just the baths, from the regular nighttime events to family activities and sauna sessions – truly something for everyone.

28. PÉCS ZOO



The Pécs Zoo awaits visitors in its magical 4.5-hectare setting on the Mecsek hillside. It offers a home to species from around the world, including endangered animals like the red-ruffed lemur, the Bengal tiger, the red panda, and even the Persian leopard, and with the arrival of the Aquarium-Terrarium complex from the city centre, there's never been a better time to visit.

37. SIKLÓS CASTLE



One of the best-preserved fortifications in Hungary stands on a hill at the bottom of the Tenkes Valley, right in the middle of Siklós town. The main elements of the fortress were built in the Middle Ages, but it bears the hallmarks of numerous architectural eras, with the main castle building surrounded by walls, towers, and bastions.

WALKING IN DOWNTOWN PÉCS



The Zsolnay Museum, the Vasarely Museum, the Museum Gallery, the Modern Hungarian Gallery, and the Nemes Endre Museum are all located in Káptalan Street, which locals — unsurprisingly — refer to as "Museum Street". When walking in downtown Pécs, visiting the Csontváry Museum on Janus Pannonius Street is highly recommended, as well as a stop-off to see the thousands of love padlocks hanging on the nearby wrought-iron walls.

11-14 OPFI



Lake Orfű is the first and smallest lake in the Western Mecsek Orfű Lake System. Particularly popular in the summertime, the busy Kistó Beach offers the chance for a refreshing dip, while fishing and boating is also possible. For more indoor pursuits, the nearby Mill Museum offers a guided tour on the history of grinding.

29. CATHEDRAL OF SAINT PETER AND SAINT PAUL



The Cathedral of Saint Peter and Saint Paul, the four-towered symbol of Pécs, dominates the Dóm Square, offering stunning views of the city from its south-east tower. As you enter the church, a magnificent interior of blue and gold colours takes your breath away. The tomb of the famous poet and bishop, Janus Pannonius is found in the undercroft. If you have the time, do not miss the opportunity to listen to the organ music in the Cathedral.

41. WINE TASTING IN VILLÁNY



Savour the elegant wines of the Villány Wine Region. With its sub-Mediterranean climate, the region has been blessed for centuries with excellent conditions for making red wines, and it has played a pioneering role in the rebirth of Hungarian winemaking, turning it into one of the most developed wine regions in Hungary, rich in wine and gastronomic experiences.
