


Plan your trip to Győr and Pannonhalma with the help of our website.

## The northwestern part of Hungary is rich in natural treasures and monuments, with the city of Győr, the Abbey of Pannonhalma, and the flora and fauna of Szigetköz all awaiting travelers with their unique adventures.

Take a walk in Győr, a city that lies at the confluence of the rivers Mosoni-Danube, Rába, and Rábca, and experience the third richest city in Hungary in terms of monuments. Wander around Pannonhalma and the famous Pannonhalma Monastery, which has been a World Heritage Site since 1996, and where the legendary Benedictine monks still go about their daily lives. Then discover the waterway of Szigetköz, which stretches for more than 800 kilometers and provides plentiful terrain for active recreation.

The Zoo accommodates 1,400 animals from 140 species housed in spacious enclosures similar to their original habitats. In addition to the native wild animals living in the domestic wilderness of Hungary, you can encounter kangaroos, jaguars, lions, tigers, camels, and ring-tailed lemurs, among other, as well as high-quality pedagogical programs.

11. CATHEDRAL OF THE ASSUMPTION OF OUR LADY, GYŐR

The Cathedral Basilica of the Assumption of Our Lady in Győr was founded during the reign of St. Stephen, and the Gothic chapel preserves one of Hungary's most important relics, the gilded herm of St. Ladislaus decorated with precious stones, as well as the skull of the knight king.

Situated on the promontory of Mosonmagyaróvár, otherwise called Királydomb, this old town castle has undergone many renovations and rebuilds over the centuries to reach its present state. It has many historical claims to fame, including location where the young Prince Matthias Hunyadi was imprisoned, as well as the safe resting place of the Holy Crown. Today, visitors are awaited by three interactive exhibitions.

THE "GENESIS OF A WINE REGION"



On the slopes of Pannonhalma Hills in Northern Transdanubia lies a small Hungarian wine region with a history that stretches back hundreds of years. Hungarian viticulture is inextricably linked to this region, and more specifically its Abbey, with the first historical mention appearing in the Archabbey Charter. The cellar road at the border of the village of Nyúl is also well worth a visit, with its wine cellars carved into the rock face.

7. SYNAGOGUE, GYŐR



The synagogue in Győr is one of the most prominent symbols of the Jewish Neolog community, and it has long been used as an architectural model for synagogues in other cities, due to the way it was integrated into its metropolitan environment. Today it operates as a museum, as well as hosting cultural events. 12. SAINT JACOB CHURCH AND VISITOR'S CENTRE, LÉBÉNY



The best kept Roman-era church in Hungary is found in Lébény just 20 km from Győr. The church is the end point of the 200 km long Hungarian Saint Jacob pilgrimage that starts in Budapest.

20. BENEDICTINE ABBEY OF PANNONHALMA

MOSONMAGYARÓVÁR CASTLE



Stroll through the lavender-scented arboretum, enjoy the majestic silence of the basilica, immerse yourself in the library's 400,000-volume collection, or head to the abbey restaurant to taste wine and dishes prepared by the monks using locally sourced ingredients.

SZIGETKÖZ



Lying between the Greater Danube and the Mosoni-Danube, Szigetköz is one of the most popular water hiking destinations in the country and offers canoeing and kayaking for visitors of all levels. Take to the water and explore the floodplain forests to catch a glimpse of beavers, herons, egrets, mallards, and much more.

8. EPISCOPAL CASTLE, GYŐR



Chapter Hill (Káptalandomb) has been the centre of the city of Győr for centuries and is home to the Episcopal Castle and the Episcopal Palace, the latter being the most intact medieval episcopal residence in Hungary. Discover the Bishop's Castle, the observation tower offering fabulous panoramic views of the city and surrounding rivers, and the cellar that houses a World War II exhibition.

14. FUTURA, MOSONMAGYARÓVÁR



Learning through play at the country's largest interactive science exhibition. Futura is divided into 4 floors, each covering one of the 4 natural elements, and visitors can immerse themselves in activities about the most exciting natural and weather phenomena, the most important laws of physics, and the most interesting optical illusions.

BAROQUE STYLE DOWNTOWN, GYŐR



One of the most charming sights of Győr, the pedestrian zone in the old town awaits visitors with fairytale streets, narrow alleys, large squares, and cosy terraces. Also unmissable are the antique trade signs on the Baroque-style buildings.
